The water value at the school will need to be replaced this spring.

Police Department-Reported in February there were 845 miles put on the squad, 1 arrests, 6 citations, 12 warnings, 2 training hours, 12 new cases investigated, 7 assists to outside agencies, 7 assists received from outside agencies, 2 court hours of court related matters, 2 animal complaints, and 4 hours of foot patrol.
